Available



History

Morpeth Town Football Club was established in 1894, and through more than a century of football have continued the tradition of carrying Amber and Black as their team colours.

The club was formed after an amalgamation between Morpeth United and Morpeth FC, playing at Stobhill Cricket Field.

In 1954 the club moved to Storey Park, and in the 1980's enjoyed a successful time in the Northern Alliance, winning the title and finishing runners-up on two other occasions, as well as lifting both the Challenge Cup and Benevolent Bowl in 1986.

The club moved to a purpose built stadium in 1994, which coincided with a League and Cup double, and with it, promotion to the Northern League. Craik Park was named after the father and son W and R Craik who had served as secretary between 1920 and 1985. Current President Ken Beattie was the man behind the stadium and since 1992 he has revived the club's fortunes.

Membership of the Northern League followed in 1994/95 and the following year saw the Second Division Championship being presented to Morpeth. The club finished 6th in the First Division at the first time of asking, as well as reaching the final of the Northumberland Senior Cup.

The club spent half a century in the Northern Football Alliance before stepping up to the Northern League on their one hundredth anniversary. In 1998-99 they made it to the final qualifying round of the FA Cup, losing 1-0 at home to Nigel Clough's Burton Albion.

After sitting comfortably mid-table between 1996/7 and 1999/2000, Morpeth narrowly avoided relegation on goal difference in the 2000/01 season, and finished once again one spot above the relegation zone in 2001/02. The next few years saw Morpeth Town move back into the middle of the table before a 6th place finish in 2005/06, Morpeth's equal top performance in the Northern League.

In 2006/07 Morpeth won the Northumberland Senior Cup for the first time since 1886 (as Morpeth Harriers) with a 3-2 victory over Blyth Spartans.

Disaster struck in 2009/10 as Morpeth Town were relegated to the second division and things got even worse a season later as Morpeth Town finished bottom of the Northern League's second tier.

The club was in dire straits with President Ken Beattie and Chairman Jim Smith trying their best to keep the club running by bringing the ground up to Northern League standards whilst being forced to ground share with local rivals Bedlington Terriers. The club was within weeks of folding at one point.

The Highwaymen began their revival in 2011/12 under the stewardship of Nick

Gray who moved to the club from Seaton Delaval and brought a number of players. In his first season Morpeth narrowly missed out on promotion back to the top tier finishing fourth and a one point won fourteen consecutive home games.

2012/13 saw the side improve once more, finishing one place higher in third position, beating out Jarrow Roofing on goal difference to earn promotion.

After earning promotion Morpeth Town managed to avoid the drop quite comfortably finishing in 17th place. During the season they also went on a historic FA Vase run to the Quarter-Final stage.

In 2014/15 saw further improvement, with the Highwaymen finishing 8th in the table and reaching the Northumberland Senior Cup Final.

Niall Harrison joined the club mid-way through last season having played for Blyth Spartans earlier in the season. Another excellent 'keeper who can hoof a ball.

David Hiftle has plenty of experience at the Northern League level and has previously captained the Highwaymen. Comfortable playing both in centre defence and at full-back.



Shaun Henderson a long time servant at Morpeth, Shaun is an attacking full back who has previously played for Newcastle United and Ashington.

James Novak signed from Ashington mid-way through last season and shone at left-back for the Highwaymen. Has had previous spells at Bedlington Terriers and Whitley Bay.



Club Captain Christopher Jewels is a tall and powerful centre-half who previously played for Hebburn Town, West Allotment Celtic and Washington.

Michael Hall is a centre-half who can also play in centre midfield. Powerful but also skilful on the ball, he previously played for West Allotment Celtic and Seaton Delaval.



Chris Swailes signs for the club as he heads into his 45-year. His unrivalled experience will be a massive boost for the young squad.

Johnny Wilson is a summer signing who plays down the left. Good going forward as well as in defence, he adds depth and talent to a strong defensive unit.

Michael Chilton a fantastic striker for the club who scored 31 goals in the last campaign and is always there or thereabouts at the top of the Northern League goal scoring charts. Ex-Newcastle Benfield and Dunston UTS.

Daniel Taggart is a powerful centre forward who likes to get amongst opposing defences. Will only improve with another season of Northern League football under his belt.



Stephen Forster a flying winger who is equally adept at defending as well as going forward. Ex Carlisle United, Birmingham City, West Allotment Celtic, Hebburn Town & Jarrow Roofing.

Steven Anderson is a very strong young player who has the ability to score great goals. Can play up front or on the flank. Ex-Clubs include Whitley Bay, Walker Central, West Denton, and Newcastle East End.

Things continued to look good as the likes of Mark Doninger and former Republic of Ireland International Alan O'Brien joined the side.



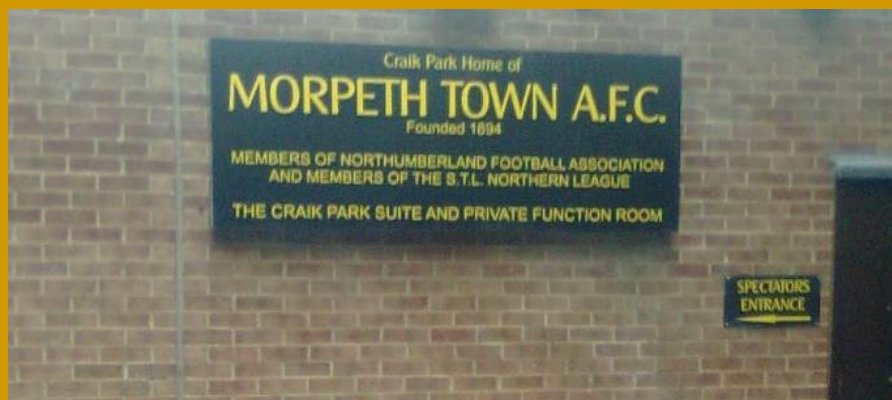

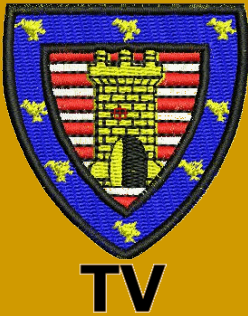

Vase run starts with strong outing

Morpeth Town 4-1 Padiham FC

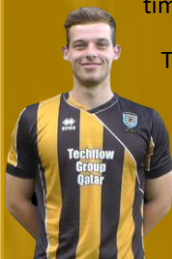


Morpeth Town's FA Vase campaign got off to a good start with a comfortable 4-1 win over Padiham FC at Craik Park on Saturday Afternoon.

Dan Taggart, Sean Taylor, Michael Chilton and skipper Keith Graydon netted for the Highwaymen who never needed to get out of first gear to beat their opposition from Lancashire, a Keiron Pickup penalty the only blip in a routine performance.

The home side put pressure on their North West Counties League side from the kick-off, Ben Sayer firing narrowly wide after just 15 seconds. Sixty seconds later Sayer tried his luck again, hitting a fizzing effort from the edge of the area just over the crossbar.

Padiham were screaming for a penalty minutes later, Alexander Murphy going down rather too easily after a James Novak shoulder charge. In the fifth minute some sharp thinking by Graydon found Taylor on the left with a quick free-kick, Taylor in turn found Taggart in the area whose first time effort hit the side netting.



The visitors were appealing for a foul again in the lead up to Morpeth's first goal, again Murphy going down with very little contact. From the challenge Sayer picked up the ball just outside of his own penalty area. The midfielder pinged a 70 yard ball over the Padiham defence into the path of Taggart who guided a chip over Sean Davis' head and into the net, despite the desperate attempts from the goalkeeper.

It should have been 2-0 five minute later, this time Taylor beating the Padiham backline with a long diagonal ball, Taggart rounding the 'keeper and slotting home, only for the referee to blow up for a high foot against Taggart, a poor decision in truth.

The onslaught continued, another quick Graydon free-kick picked out Novak on the left, his cross was played into the path of Taylor eight yards out who stung the 'keepers palms with a vicious effort.

The home side were denied a penalty two minutes later, Jordan Fry reaching a Novak corner first, only to be wiped out by Davis after the ball had been headed. The visitors were clamouring for a

penalty of their own on 25 minutes, Sean Cookson firing wide as Karl Dryden closed him down, taking out the wingers feet as the ball trickled wide.

Town's second came a minute later. A quick Taylor throw-in saw Sayer and Graydon combine well to play in Taylor who fired low into the bottom right hand corner, the ball hitting the stanchion and coming back into play. Players and fans alike were screaming that the ball had gone over the line, and after consultation with his assistant the referee awarded the goal, to the protests of the Padiham players.



Within a minute, the visitors nearly pulled a goal back, Chris Turner's curling free-kick headed onto the crossbar by Curtis Haley. The visitors came into the game during the final 15 minutes of the first half and went close again when Haley played an excellent through ball into the path of Murphy, but Dryden smothered at the strikers' feet. 2-0 the half time score.

The Highwaymen pressed hard in the opening salvos of the second period, Graydon going close with a 25 yard effort soon after the re-start. Taggart should have doubled his individual tally on 52 minutes after some flowing interplay down the right Graydon curled a through ball with the outside of his boot into the stride of the Morpeth striker who slid his effort wide.

Padiham put together a period of pressure in the following few minutes as Morpeth sat back. A right wing corner fell to Andrew Hill in the middle of the penalty area, but his effort was cleared off the line by David Hiftle.



The visitors had failed to make their chances pay, and Morpeth capitalised, adding a third with a sublime move. Shaun Henderson picked out the run of Ben Sayer with a 50 yard lofted ball, Sayer dropping the ball off to Taylor on the right. The forward crossed early for Michael Chilton eight yards out who fired a first time effort into the roof of the net.

Novak went close to adding a fourth within three minutes, a right wing free-kick from 25 yards out was hit left footed by the full-back and was destined for the top right hand corner, forcing a fantastic diving save from Davis.

The visitors were awarded a lifeline when Sayer fouled Kieron Pickup in the area. The Padiham No.9 dusted himself off and stepped up and sent the 'keeper the wrong way, making it 3-1. Substitute Hill narrowly fired over a left wing cross minutes later, which would have left a nervy last 15 minutes.

Despite pressure from the visitors, they couldn't muster any attempts on goal and Morpeth looked to hit them on the counter. A Taylor cross was almost diverted into his own net by Lee Botham on 82 minutes.

Morpeth did add a fourth with just second remaining in normal time, Steven Anderson breaking down the left crossing for Lee McAndrew whose dummy left Graydon to tap in at the back post unmarked.

Opposition History

Football teams have been around in Bedlington since the early 1900's. The present club was formed in 1949 under the name of Bedlington Mechanics joining the Northern Combination League. The first honour of the new era was the Northumberland Minor Cup in season 1953/54 and they followed this up with their only Northern Combination title in 1954/55. During these years they changed their name from Mechanics to Colliery Town and then as Bedlington Colliery Welfare they joined the Northern Alliance League in 1955/56.

They spent 8 seasons in this league before disbanding at the end of the 1962/63 season. During this spell they won their first Northern Alliance League Cup. During this period they played their home games at West Sleekburn 'A' Pit. In 1965 the club re-formed as Bedlington Colliery Welfare and moved to Milnes Park staying there three seasons before moving to the present location of Dr. Pit Welfare Park. In the 1966/67 season the club did the "double" in the Northern Alliance League and in 1969/70 won their third League Cup final. At the end of the 1970/71 season they had to leave the Northern Alliance and played in a number of minor local leagues until season 1979/80. For this season they joined the Tyneside Amateur League under the name of Bedlington United and in 1980/81 were re-admitted to the Northern Alliance League.

They won their fourth Northern Alliance League Cup in season 1981/82 and in the next season were elected as founder members of the Northern League 2nd Division winning promotion to the 1st Division in season 1984/85 as division runners-up. In their first season in the 1st division they finished runners-up but sadly in the next season they were relegated back to the 2nd division. The club spluttered along in the next few seasons and early in 1993 faced the real prospect of going out of business as they were marooned at the bottom of the 2nd division and had their fixtures suspended by the league for a month. Bedlington stalwart Billy Ward with almost 40 years at the helm approached local businessmen Dave and Keith Perry and asked them to mount a rescue operation. What happened next is the stuff dreams are made of.

With extinction ruled out the Terriers as they had been renamed stormed back and in the very next season won the 2nd division title. Sadly, Billy Ward had departed this world and missed this renaissance although his memory still burns bright at the club. Consolidation followed and gradually the tide turned. In 1996/97 the club marched to St. James Park and picked up the NFA Senior Cup beating Morpeth Town 2 – 0 in the final. The same season saw them win the Northern League Cup by defeating Billingham Synthonia 3 – 0 in the final. In season 1997/98 it got even better

as the Terriers ran away with the 1st Division title by a clear 12 points scoring 120 goals in only 38 games. They completed the season by retaining the NFA Senior Cup defeating Blyth Spartans 2 – 1 in the final at St. James Park.

The 1998/99 season was Bedlington's 50th year since the club was formed and what a season it was. It started with a Cleator Cup win over Dunston Fed and continued with a march to the second round proper of the F.A. Cup after defeating Colchester United of the Football League Division Two 4 – 1 in round one before finally falling away at Scunthorpe where the "Woof Woof Terriers" chant was born. The league title was retained this time with 26 points to spare, 128 goals and 101 points. The other story of the season was the F.A. Carlsberg Vase where the Terriers marched all the way to Wembley Stadium for a day in the club's history never to be forgotten. A last minute goal from opponents Tiverton Town denied them the trophy but with an open top bus ride to follow on the return, 1998/99 was the year that Bedlington Terriers put themselves firmly on the footballing map.

The coming seasons were still successful, but a return trip to the FA Vase final was just that little too far out of reach with Quarter final and Semi Final appearances still ensuring they were one of the top sides at that level in the country.

Meanwhile, the Northern League title in total was won for five consecutive seasons, equalling the run of Blyth Spartans when they were sweeping all before them and were just piped to the post in the sixth season by Brandon United. Along with the Northern League titles, Bedlington also won the League Cup in 2001 and the Northumberland Senior Cup in 2002 and 2004.

With such success in the previous years, there was always going to be a period of change and

that started during the 2005/6 season when mass changes started to happen behind the scenes. The team still managed to reach the FA Vase fourth round but things were not well and in the close season Bedlington entered a very dark few months which almost saw the team disappear forever.

A summer of trauma ensued as the club veered on the edge of extinction, and the eventual departure of the unimaginably successful management partnership of Keith Perry and Tony Lowery, until current Chairman David Holmes stepped in along with local businessman Graeme Redpath, steadied the ship, and showed the way to a brighter future.

Even a serious arson attack on the Clubhouse, soon after the takeover, couldn't dent the determination to get Bedlington Terriers back on track. However, the effects of the summer of trauma had its impact on the pitch, as a squad of mainly teenagers found it difficult to compete against much more experienced teams. Facing almost certain relegation heading into April 2007, a stunning finish to the season saw them lift up to third bottom in the table. With Newcastle Blue Star heading for the Unibond League, it meant that only two clubs were relegated and the Terriers were reprieved. However by November things had not progressed as hoped and Tom Wade left the club. A week later it was announced that the management duo of Perry and Lowery were back to help the Terriers climb the table once again, with Holmes leading the club.

After finishing 7th in Div. 1 of the Northern League at the end of the 2011 – 2012 season, Dave Holmes resigned as Chairman of the club with local businessman Ronan Liddane taking over the reins. Ronan has a fine footballing pedigree, having played for teams such as Blyth Spartans, Blue Star and having Managed Crook Town.
